Tuesday	<p>Read a story book for 15 minutes.</p> <p>Phonics – flash card phonics – choosing a sound less confident with, putting it into a word, then into a sentence.</p> <p>Writing: Creative writing, use the picture in the resource pack to spark your imagination and write a short story. Include lots of adjectives to make it interesting. Practise spellings</p>	<p>Numbots 10mins.</p> <p>Use the number square you made yesterday to help you answer addition questions.</p> <p>Top tip – Start with the biggest number and add the smaller number to it. Worksheets found in resource pack.</p>	<p>Cosmic Kids Yoga – We’re going on a bear hunt https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=KAT5NiWHFIU</p> <p>History – At the end of the week is VE Day. Today, I’d like you to research as much as you can about VE day and take notes. Discuss with parents/siblings/grandparents what is VE Day. Vocabulary: Second world war, celebrate, party, 8th May 1945, Europe, war, festival, surrender, Germany, fighting, end, Winston Churchill, United Kingdom, United States, liberation, victory.</p>

Practise spellings</p>	<p>Rockstars – 10 mins.</p> <p>Use the number square again today to help you solve a range of different calculations. Worksheet found in resource pack.</p>	<p>Joe Wicks PE https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6v-a_dpwhro</p> <p>Geography – Today, I’d like you to look at the map attached. Your job is to find out and colour in the countries who were our ‘allies’ in green, and those who were against us in red.</p>
Thursday	<p>Read a story book for 15 minutes –</p> <p>Spelling test.</p> <p>Phonics – What sound do you find tricky? Practise it, put it into words. Can you create a sentence using the words?</p> <p>Handwriting: Handwriting sheets, focusing on Phase 5 sentences. Worksheets in resource pack. No need to print, can practise sentences on lined paper, focusing on letter formation.</p>	<p>TTRockstars/Numbots 10mins</p> <p>Maths mastery. Thinking about addition fact families. If $5 + 5 = 10$, what is $10 - \underline{\quad} = 5$.</p> <p>Children to look at the different numbers and represent them in different ways. Worksheets found in resource pack.</p>	<p>Supermovers – BBC</p> <p>History – Everything you’ve learned the last two days about VE Day, I’d like you to create a poster. It needs to include: information about VE Day, pictures and be eye catching.</p>
Friday	<p>Read a story book for 15 minutes.</p> <p>Phonics – Phonics play.</p>	<p>TTRockstars BATTLE!</p>	<p>If you can get out with a parent, try the Daily Mile – can you run or walk for 1 mile? (about 12 minutes’ slow jog).</p>

This week I have attached a resource pack, you do not necessarily need to print off the resource pack but use it as a guide if preferred. Again, I have linked learning to learned skills in Writing and Mathematics. In terms of topic learning, I have focussed on VE Day which is celebrated on the 8th May.

In regards to spellings, I would set 5-10 spellings per week for your child. I have not listed specific spellings to be practised at home. I would advise to think about the phonics sounds your child may be struggling with and focus on those.

If not,

- common exception words
- numbers one-twenty
- days of the week
- months on the year

All of the above would be good to focus on. These are all spellings that children are expected to know as they transition into Year 2. Like I said, I would focus on what your child struggles with and move on from there, mixing them up. If you would like a list of common exception words, they can be found online, if not email me and I can send them across. I hope this helps!
