Attendance.

We expect pupils to be in school everyday. We can not authorise term time absence except in exceptional circumstances and where appropriate, Essex County Council will issue fines. Our target for the whole school is 97% attendance, and we are expected to promote positive attendance and support all pupils to

Our target for the whole school is 97% attendance, and we are expected to promote positive attendance and support all pupils to be able to attend school regularly. We monitor attendance weekly and will invite parents and carers of pupils who have attendance that causes concern to meet with us to improve. Attendance for each pupil is included in the year end school report – the chart on the right gives an indication as to how much missed learning time each child's percentage equates to each year. We have a statutory duty, as parents do, to ensure that pupils are at school every day. Thank you for understanding and supporting our whole school community by ensuring excellent attendance whenever possible.

Earrings.

A friendly reminder that earrings need to be studs and not hoop or dangly earings. If children wear earrings to school, they must be removed for PE/on PE days. Essex County Council recommend that earrings are not worn during PE. All earrings will need to be removed prior to PE lessons for safety reasons. If children have their earrings in on the day of PE they will unfortunately not be able to take part. If you have any concerns regarding this, please contact us prior to the PE lesson.

If you are planning to have your child/ren's ears pierced, please can it be arranged for the start of the 6-week summer holiday to reduce potential risk during PE lessons. Thank you for your support.





Home learning at Westwood 2023

Please see the home learning expectations for each year group below. Supporting your children with home learning helps to build on their school learning as well as helping to adopt good learning behaviours.


Please kindly note that home learning is no longer optional and is a requirement.

We will no longer be using Sumdog and instead will be providing each pupil with a White Rose homework book which matches our Maths learning in the classroom. As well as this, KS1 and some of our Year 3 pupils will be following the Read Write Inc programme. Instead of stage books they will be bringing home their Read Write Inc book to work on for the week, along with a library book chosen during their library session. New Read Write Inc books will be sent out each Monday. Lastly, across the school we will now be using Purple Mash to set spellings. Spelling lists will be sent out with homework on Friday but there are extra activities to complete on Purple Mash based on the weekly words which teachers will set as 2dos for the children.

Homework will be set weekly and will be checked/marked by adults in class. Please send White Rose homework in every Wednesday to be marked in school. Spelling tests will be on Friday and new homework will come home each Friday too. As always, if you have any questions regarding homework please see the class teachers, we are happy to help. Thank you for your continued support!

Reception	The expectation is to read each night, signing the reading record to show how your child is getting on. In addition to this, phonics books will be sent home following our Read Write Inc scheme. The class teacher will guide the class on which activity to complete each week. Class teachers will also set challenge homework throughout the school year linked to topics/ learning focuses within the classroom. This will be communicated to parents as the year goes on.
Year 1	The expectation is to read each night, signing the reading record to show how your child is getting on.
Year 2	Spelling practise each evening in preparation for weekly spelling test. Completion of one Maths activity in the White Rose homework book each week,
Year 3	as guided by the class teacher.
Year 5	In addition, half termly challenge homework will be set based on the topic to engage pupils and enrich learning.
Year 4	The expectation is to read each night signing the reading record to show how your child is getting on. Spelling practise each evening in preparation for weekly spelling test. Completion of one activity in the CGP times tables book as guided by the class teacher. This is to prepare the children for the year 4 Multiplication test in the Summer term. In addition, half termly challenge homework will be set based on the topic to engage pupils and enrich learning.
Year 6	The expectation is to read each night, signing the reading record to show how your child is getting on. Spelling practise each evening in preparation for weekly spelling test. White Rose maths book, CGP arithmetic, comprehension and GPS books will be sent home to be used to support the upcoming SATS tests in the Summer term. The class teacher will communicate which tasks to complete. In addition, research and fact finding challenge homework will be set linked to topics.
