

One Planning

For those children on the SEN register who have regular One Plan's I wanted to share the format and structure of the One Plans for this year.

One Planning is a graduated approach to fulfil our statutory duties as set out in the SEN Code of Practice 0-25 years (2015) and the Early Years Foundation Stage (2021). It sets out the cycle of assess, plan, do, review (APDR) in a personcentered way.

At Westwood, we review children's One Plans 3 times across a school year. These reviews are carried out by the class teachers who are best placed to understand and accommodate your children's needs. However, this process is overseen by myself as SENCO and meetings further supported by LSAs, specialists involved your child and our learning mentor, when appropriate.

The meetings should run for around 20-30 minutes and will follow the format:

- · Collecting the views of the team around the child including your child's views.
- Reviewing the previous One Plan targets
- · Setting new targets or adapting the strategies for targets not met, based on the views gathered.
- Arranging a date and time for the next One Plan.

Following the meeting, the updated One Plan will be shared with parents and all staff working with your child. These then become working documents and guide your child's provision until the next review.

One thing we find really useful is asking parents to think about their views prior to the meeting. We gather the following:

- · What we like and admire about your child.
- · What's important to and what's important for your child?
- · What's working well at home and at school?
- · What's not working at home and at school?
- · How can we best support your child?

We really appreciate your engagement with the One Planning process and hope you find the cycle useful in supporting your child's needs. **Mrs Clarke**

Attendance.

We expect pupils to be in school everyday. We can not authorise term time absence except in exceptional circumstances and where appropriate, Essex County Council will issue fines.

Our target for the whole school is 97% attendance, and we are expected to promote positive attendance and support all pupils to be able to attend school regularly.
